

AP Music Royalties Fund Acquires Catalogue from Rock & Roll Hall of Fame Co-Founder of the Small Faces and Faces

AP Music Royalties Fund (APMRF), a fully regulated Liechtenstein Alternative Investment Fund, has acquired the master and neighbouring rights catalogue of one of the founding members of the Small Faces and Faces.

The Small Faces were founded in 1965, helping define the mod sound of the era. In 1969, Ronnie Lane, Kenney Jones and Ian McLagan joined Rod Stewart and Ronnie Wood to form Faces, recording four studio albums between 1970 and 1973 and becoming one of the era's most celebrated live acts.

The acquired catalogue comprises rights in numerous sound recordings including the Small Faces classics "All or Nothing", "Itchycoo Park" and "Lazy Sunday" as well as the Faces hit singles "Stay with Me" and "Ooh La La" - a body of work that remains in continuous use across streaming, sync, broadcast and reissue.

APMRF has been advised on this transaction by Star Music Fund and Cadence Solicitors.

"This is a truly iconic catalogue relating to some of the defining bands of British rock," said Iain Maxwell of APMRF. "These songs have a proven, multi-generational audience that continues to find new listeners to this day, and we're honoured to be entrusted with them."
